

Introducing the Youth Engagement Strategy

- First created in 2013 to address issues raised by the Youth Advisory Committee facing Penticton's young people population.
- BGC Okanagan has administrated YES Penticton for 10 years.
- Throughout the duration of the program, it has relied on various grants, donations, and has yet to be fully funded to sustain operation costs and continues to have nonsustainable funding.

Addressing Barriers:

- -We encourage our council and community partners to amplify our youth's voices and provide them with the platform they deserve.


