Congratulations on your decision to move to Penticton. Welcome home! Use this checklist to help make your transition go as smoothly and quickly as possible.

Step 1 - Find a Place to Live

You might need a short-term place to stay before finding the right home. Search visitpenticton.com for an online inventory of B&Bs, motels, vacation rentals, hostels and campsites.

Step 2 - Set Up Your City Accounts

☐ Electricity & Water

To set up a utilities account, you'll need two pieces of ID with your signature, and if you're renting, a copy of your rental agreement. You can download the form at penticton.ca/ utilities-accounts and return it to City Hall by email or drop off at 171 Main Street during office hours.

☐ Garbage, Recycling & Yard Waste

The City of Penticton posts the residential garbage collection schedule online. You can also call 250-490-3888 for details or visit the City website. *Important*: If you live outside the City of Penticton, your residential waste collection may be handled by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen (RDOS).

After your move, here are some ways to get rid of packing materials and other household items.

- Once a year, large items such as furniture or appliances are picked up curbside.
- Yard waste and recycling is collected on alternating weeks.
- You can purchase stickers for additional garbage (over the 2 bag limit) at City Hall.

Other waste such as glass, plastic wrap, beverage containers or paint can be taken to J&C Bottle Depot (200 Rosetown Ave). You can also return many items, including cardboard boxes, old appliances and household hazardous waste, to the Campbell Mountain Landfill (1765 Reservoir Road).

Step 3 - Change Your Address

- ☐ Contact FortisBC to transfer or set up a natural gas account. Calling at least two days prior to your move-in is recommended. Ph: 1-888-224-2710.
- ☐ Transfer your telephone, internet and/or cable.

 If you require a new account, you'll find several telecommunications companies in Penticton, including Shaw, Bell, Telus, Rogers and the local service provider, ABC Communications.
- ☐ Visit any Autoplan Agency to update your auto insurance.
- ☐ Visit Service Canada at 386 Ellis Street to update your passport or to discuss issues including your El, CPP, Disability Benefits or Foreign Credentials Referral.
- ☐ Visit Service BC at 40 Calgary Avenue to:
 - update the address on your B.C. driver's licence or to switch to a B.C. driver's licence from another province or country.
 - update or enrol in the provincial healthcare program (Medical Services Plan), which is required for B.C. residents. You can also apply online.
 - update or register to vote provincially.

Step 4 - Healthcare

Penticton Regional Hospital, at 550 Carmi Avenue, is a full-service facility offering 24-hour emergency services. The Penticton Health Centre, at 740 Carmi Avenue, also offers a range of health services including immunizations (Ph: 250-770-3434).

- ☐ Find a family doctor: Add your name to the centralized waitlist at divisionsbc.ca/sos. You can also check the find-a-physician tool maintained by the BC College of Physicians and Surgeons or call around local doctors' offices to add your name to specific waiting lists.
- ☐ **Walk-in medical clinics**: While waiting for a doctor, you can visit a walk-in clinic. These include:

☐ Find Childcare

Visit the City's Child Care webpage for the latest information on how to start your search. You can request a referral online from Penticton Child Care Resource and Referral (CCRR), which provides information involving childcare options. Also check out the Facebook group Penticton Childcare, which is a great place to post questions, and the Penticton Moms Supporting Moms Facebook page, where you can get connected with other local parents.

☐ Other Family Support

From special needs assistance to counselling and childcare referrals, OneSky Community Resources is well acquainted with Penticton services and can help you find what you need. They can also help you apply for childcare subsidies.

□ Register for School

Penticton's public schools belong to School District 67: Okanagan Skaha. For a full listing of your options (including French immersion and alternative learning programs), visit sd67.bc.ca. Other options in Penticton include a French language public school and numerous private schools. Another big draw for many families is the Okanagan Hockey Academy.

Your post-secondary options include Okanagan College, Sprott Shaw College and two flight training schools: Topflight and BP Aviation.

☐ Fun Things to Do

Our community also has fantastic amenities including a modern Community Centre complete with two pools, library, museum and the Penticton Art Gallery. Step 8 - Getting Around

One of the greatest things about living in Penticton is the fact that you can drive from one side of the city to the other within 10 minutes. Your other options to get around include cycling, walking, taxis and public transit.

The new Lake to Lake Bike Route is now partly completed, providing a dedicated bike route between Okanagan Lake and throughout the downtown area, with plans to connect it to Skaha Lake. For maps and more information, For more information, visit penticton.ca/cycling and penticton.ca/transportation.

Local bus service is provided by BC Transit. You can view route information and current schedules online or download the Rider Guide for reference. Other bus services include a handyDART service for those with disabilities and regional bus services to neighbouring communities including a \$5 fare for the route to Kelowna.
