- Dog Control is a service of bylaw enforcement specifically related to dog and dog owner compliance with the Responsible Dog Owner Bylaw.
- The Dog Control Officer is responsible for managing the Dog Shelter where lost or abandoned dogs are kept until they are claimed or re-homed.
- The City owns the dwelling and shelter facility located at 2330 Dartmouth Drive and contracts Dog Control services.
