 - o leases, licences, & residential tenancies (0% vacancy)
- Identify, negotiate and draft sales, purchase and lease agreements ensuring legal and Charter requirements are met while protecting the City's interest.
- Answer inquiries, provide advise, complete legal documents for other departments and register documents at Land Titles
- Assisting CFO with administration of the City's liability insurance program was added in late 2017.

2017 Accomplishments

- Brunswick Affordable Housing Lease negotiated and signed.
- All leases, licences and residential tenancies maintained in current and fully paid status (excluding non-profits and one residential tenant which resulted in eviction).
- Beach vending program reviewed and changes resulting from public input implemented.
- Purchase of northeast corner Westminster and Main Street for placement of Public Art.
- Received purchase offers for City owned land totalling over \$3.5MM





2018 Initiatives

- Re-establish long term lease for Okanagan Lake Marina
- Develop & implement a policy to deal with sale/disposal of City Owned properties, including unsolicited requests to purchase City owned land
- Implement a Nominal Lease Policy for non-profit societies tenancies.
