Advance voting for the 2021 Local Government By-Election will take place between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on the following dates at the Penticton Trade and Convention Centre, 273 Power Street:

- Wednesday, June 9, 2021
- Saturday, June 12, 2021
- Wednesday, June 16, 2021

General Voting day is Saturday, June 19, 2021 between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. at the Penticton Trade and Convention Centre, 273 Power Street or at the Seniors' Drop-In Centre, 2965 South Main Street.

Please note that the Seniors' Drop-In Centre is a smaller venue and there may be lineups. We will make every attempt to get everyone voting as quickly as possible while maintaining COVID-19 safety protocols.




City launches new YYF Penticton Airport website

Stage 1 Normal Water Restrictions are in Effect

In order to mitigate potential drought, Stage 1 (Normal) water restrictions are in place from May 1 to August 31, with further levels of restrictions to be added if necessary.

Be water-smart and do your part by thinking about your water-usage this summer to protect Penticton's water supply. Outdoor watering is one of the leading causes of water-use in the Okanagan, and residents must follow their designated schedule.

Residents may irrigate 3 times per week, only on their designated days according to their street address. Odd numbered addresses are permitted to irrigate on Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday only. Even numbered addresses are permitted to irrigate on Wednesday, Friday and Sunday only. Watering on Mondays is now prohibited during all restriction stages.

Responsible Liquor Consumption in Designated Public Places – Summer 2021

Council gave final reading to "Liquor Consumption (Okanagan Beach east of Power Street, Rotary Park, Okanagan Lake Park, Marina Way Park and Skaha Park) Bylaw No. 2021-11", a bylaw that allows liquor consumption in select parks and beaches along the Okanagan and Skaha lakefronts from May – October 15, 2021 from 12 PM to 8 PM. Council directed staff to report back in November 2021 regarding the program.

RDOS Compost Facility Update and Joint Study

Council directed staff to proceed with a joint study with the RDOS to evaluate the impacts to the City of implementation of an in-vessel composting facility at the Campbell Mountain Landfill and recommended that the Financial Plan be amended to include \$30,000 funding for the study, of which \$15,000 would be funded from sewer surplus, and \$15,000 from general accumulated surplus.
