## Tips for Recycling Old Books

Looking to clear out space on your book shelf? Do *not* throw them in the trash or your home recycling carts, as books are not accepted by Recycle BC. Here are some tips about how to dispose of books responsibly:

- 1. Is the book damaged or outdated? RECYCLE**  
If the book is not in good enough condition to be donated, it may be dropped off for recycling at these locations:
  - Blue recycling bins from 'Planet Earth' at Penticton Library
  - Book recycling bins at Campbell Mountain Landfill
- 2. Is the book gently used? REUSE**  
Gently used books may be donated to:
  - The Penticton Library
  - Local charities or community organizations
  - A 'Little Library,' with more details at [penticton.ca/little-libraries](http://penticton.ca/little-libraries)
  - Resell locally or online

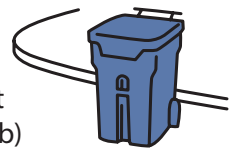

## Be Cart Smart

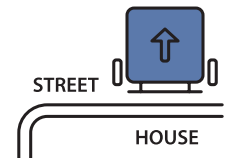
To the curb by  
**7:00 am**

Place your carts properly for collection. Carts improperly placed may not be emptied.

**Park it**  
On the street, with the wheels against the curb, or on the shoulder (if no curb) by 7 a.m.



**Point it**  
Point the arrow on the cart lid towards the road.



**Space it**  
Leave at least an arm's length distance on all sides.

# Collection Solutions

## Missing Carts, Moving, Changes or Repairs?

### Carts are City of Penticton Property

If you sell your property and move, or give up tenancy, your carts must remain at the property. If you purchase a house and would like to change the cart sizes or quantities, you can request a change by visiting [penticton.ca/carts](http://penticton.ca/carts), emailing [publicworks@penticton.ca](mailto:publicworks@penticton.ca) or calling 250-490-2500.

Please note that changes to the cart sizes or quantities can only be authorized by the registered property owner. All cart changes are subject to an administration fee. Please consult the most recent fees and charges bylaw for pricing.

If your cart is stolen or damaged and requires repairs, contact the City Public Works Dept. by emailing [publicworks@penticton.ca](mailto:publicworks@penticton.ca) or calling 250-490-2500.

## Waste Not Collected?

Not having all your items picked up can be frustrating, but there is often an explanation.

Common reasons for items being left behind:

- Items not set out on time (must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on scheduled collection day).
- Carts must be spaced a minimum of 1 metre/3 feet away from each other, and any obstacles such as vehicles or trees.
- Contamination of recyclables with garbage or yard waste.
- Cart is overfilled or lid is not securely closed.
- Presence of prohibited waste.
- Contamination of yard waste with garbage or recyclables.
- Recycling or yard waste not scheduled for collection that particular week.

## Large Item Collection

Place a maximum of 2 items per household for collection April 15-19 (marked in **purple** on the calendar page 8). Items must be at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled garbage day.

- Common items include furniture, large appliances and mattresses.
- **NO** renovation waste, including toilets, plumbing, hot water tanks and doors.
- **Not** accepted are items with a gas motor, automotive parts, or objects made of concrete.
- Max. weight 90 kg/200 lbs per item.
- Return electronics (TVs, computers, etc) to your nearest Return-it Electronics depot. ([return-it.ca/electronics](http://return-it.ca/electronics))
- Recycle small appliances (toasters, vacuums, hair dryers, etc). See [electrorecycle.ca](http://electrorecycle.ca).
- An additional truck will pick up your items, not your usual collection truck.

## Unlimited Yard Waste Weeks

### Spring and Fall

Four times per year, on the dates marked in **orange** on the calendar page 8, residents can place unlimited quantities of yard waste at the curb for collection.

After your city-issued cart is filled, excess yard waste can be placed in kraft paper bags or cans clearly marked "yard waste" and branches must be bundled with string or twine and placed out for collection by 7 a.m. on your regular collection day.

- An additional truck will collect your extra yard waste after your garbage is collected.
- Additional yard waste can be placed in any container clearly marked as 'yard waste only'.
- Paper bags that are ripped or heavily saturated cannot be collected.
- Branches shall have a maximum diameter of 5 centimeters.
- Bundles shall be less than 1-metre long and weigh less than 25 kg.

## Extra Garbage or Yard Waste?

Display a Tag-a-Bag sticker clearly on each extra bag over the cart limit. Place at the curb along with your cart on your regular collection day.

# Recycling Guide

Recycling is collected *every other week* marked in **blue** on the calendar. No need to sort.

**Please place materials in loosely, with NO plastic bags.**

## Accepted Items & How to Prepare

### Mixed Paper



**Newspapers** and newspaper inserts, including advertising flyers.

**Magazines, catalogues & inserts**

**Office/computer paper & envelopes** (window style accepted)

**Coated paper plates, bowls and cups**

**Compressed paper hangers**

**Greeting cards & non-foil wrap** (incl paper flower wrap)

**Phone books**

**Paper bags** (grocery, lunch bags, prescription bags)

**Kraft or multi-layered paper bags**

**Pet food bags, flour and sugar bags** (no foil or plastic lined bags)

**Single-use paper party décor**

**Shredded paper:**

*accepted only if inside a firmly tied, **clear** plastic bag and placed in recycle cart.*

### Boxboard & Cardboard



**Boxes** for cereal, tissues, shoes, pizza, laundry detergent, etc.

**Box trays** for bottled water, soft drinks, cans, etc. (recycle plastic overwrap at depot)

**Cardboard rolls** from toilet paper and paper towel

**Corrugated cardboard** (moving boxes, banking boxes)

**Cardboard egg cartons,** take-out beverage trays

**Paper-based flower pots**

**Paper gift bags or boxes**

*Flatten boxboard and place directly into recycle cart.*

### Corrugated Cardboard



**Clean, dry cardboard** (unwaxed)

**Pizza boxes:** remove food debris and liner

Staples and packing tape are accepted

*Flatten and place in recycle cart.*

*ONLY cardboard placed inside of recycle cart will be collected.*

### Paper Containers for Liquids



**Paper beverage cups**

**Gable top cartons** for milk-type beverages, cream, substitute eg sugar, molasses

**Aseptic (Tetra-Pak™-style) boxes** for soup/broth, milk-type beverage sauces

**Boxes for frozen food,** including ice cream, desserts, frozen pizza entrees

**Non-durable paper food containers**

*Empty and rinse all cartons; remove lids and recycle separately in cart.*

## NOT Accepted

**Plastic bags used to wrap newspapers** (depot)

**Paper towels, tissues or serviettes**

**Hard cover or paperback books**

Padded envelopes (depot)

Musical greeting cards, ribbon or bows

Loose shredded paper

Photographs or negatives

**Plastic overwrap** (depot)

**Paper towels or tissues**

Foil-lined bags (depot) (e.g. chips)

Residue in pizza boxes or flower pots

Paper straws or non-paper insulating cup wraps

Plastic-lined pet food bags

Waxed cardboard boxes (e.g. produce shipping boxes)

Plastic overwrap (depot)

Stand-up pouches (depot)

Paper straws

Juice cartons (take to Return-It Depot for deposit refund)

Foil, foil-lined or plastic-lined boxes (e.g. pet food)

*Remember to recycle cup and cartons in your recycle cart.*

## Accepted Items & How to Prepare

### Metal Tins / Cans Aluminum Foil / Cans



**Aluminum or steel cans** for food, pet food, etc.

**Aluminum foil and foil containers** including foil take-out containers

**Metal-rimmed spiral cardboard containers** for frozen juice, dough, potato chips, baby formula, etc.

*Empty and rinse. Drop lid into can and squeeze top slightly. Labels and lids accepted.*

*Take deposit return items to a bottle depot.*

### Plastic Bottles, Jugs, Jars & Cups



Clean, dry plastic packaging with hard sides including:

- **plastic bottles & jars** for food, soap, shampoo, household cleaners, laundry products, vitamins & pills, cosmetics, etc.
- **plastic jugs** for cooking oil, detergent, cleaning products, windshield washer, etc.
- **plastic cold beverage cups**
- **plastic straws, plastic stir sticks, plastic utensils**

*Spray, pump and pull-up tops accepted. Do not need to remove lids. Empty and rinse thoroughly.*

### Plastic Tubs, Trays & Clamshells



Clean, dry plastic packaging with hard sides including:

- **clamshells** for baked goods, fruit, eggs, etc.
- **tubs & pails** for margarine, dairy products (yogurt, sour cream, ice cream, etc), detergent, etc.
- **trays** for deli chicken, single-serve meals, prepared foods
- **microwaveable bowls/cups**
- **housewares and hardware packaging**, including for screws, picture hangers, etc.
- **plastic garden pots and trays**
- **plastic tape dispensers, plastic dental floss containers**

*Containers with clear or black bottom with clear domes are accepted. Empty and rinse containers. Do not need to remove lids.*

### Aerosol Cans & Caps



**Aerosol spray cans** for food, air fresheners, shaving cream, hair spray, deodorant, etc.

**Aluminum pie plates and baking trays**

**Aluminum foil**

**Thin-gauge metal tins**

**Empty cans only.** Remove caps and recycle separately in recycle cart.

### Pots, pans or baking trays

### Scrap metal, hardware or wiring

Paint cans (depot)

Foil gift wrap, foil-lined chip bags or foil-backed paper

# Recycling Depots



You can recycle **even more than ever!**

The following items are **not** accepted for curbside collection.

Please take these items to your nearest depot for safe recycling:

**NOT Accepted**

## Flexible Plastics

**Stand-up and zipper lock pouches** for granola, coffee, frozen berries or vegetables, baby food.

**Crinkly wrappers** including bags for chips, dried pasta, candy, and cereal; wet wipe dispensers; snack and chocolate bar wrappers.

**Flexible packaging** for fresh pasta, pre-packaged deli meats, pre-packaged cheese.

**Woven and net plastic bags** for produce, fruit.

**Non-food protective packaging** such as plastic shipping envelopes, plastic air packets, bubble wrap.

**Plastic bags** for groceries, dry cleaning, bread, newspapers/ flyers, produce & salad, frozen vegetables and outer milk bags.

**Plastic overwrap** from water and pop flats; bulk paper towel or toilet paper packages, and hygiene product packaging.

**Bags & overwrap** from garden products, water softener & road salt; mattresses, furniture and electronics.



- Biodegradable or Oxo plastics
- Plastic squeeze tubes
- Plastic-lined paper
- Plastic strapping
- 6-pack rings
- PVC/Vinyl
- Squishy foam packaging
- Paper-lined plastic

## Glass

**Non-deposit glass bottles and jars**

Clear or coloured.

Empty and rinse containers.

Recycle metal or plastic lids in your recycle cart.



- Beverage containers (take to a *Return-It Depot* for deposit refund)
- Glasses, dishes, cookware or ceramic
- Window glass or mirror

## Polystyrene Foam Packaging

**Foam containers and trays**, e.g. meat, egg cartons, take-out clamshells, cups and bowls.

**Moulded foam cushion packaging**

for protecting electronics, small appliances, etc.

Empty and rinse food containers. Remove liners and plastic wrap from meat /food trays.

**White and coloured foam products must be separated at the depot.**



- Foam peanuts, packing chips or noodles
- Blue or pink foam board insulation
- Liquid absorbing pads or liners
- Shrink wrap for meat or other food

# Recycle Your E-Waste

Do you have unused electronics stacking up around the house? Maybe it's an old TV, laptop, broken printer, monitor or audio-visual cables? If you're ready for a clean-out, please do not toss these items in the trash. E-waste can leach toxic chemicals into the ground – and clog our landfill unnecessarily.

Electronic and electrical items can be dropped off at a number of local depots, including Penticton and Area Cooperative Enterprises (PACE), which specializes in e-waste recycling. PACE accepts donations of used electronics, many of which they refurbish and repurpose to sell on-site. You'll find monitors, computers, laptops or other tech equipment at affordable prices.

PACE partners with the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen to collect and sort e-waste from landfills across the region. Workers also disassembled almost 9,000 mattresses last year. 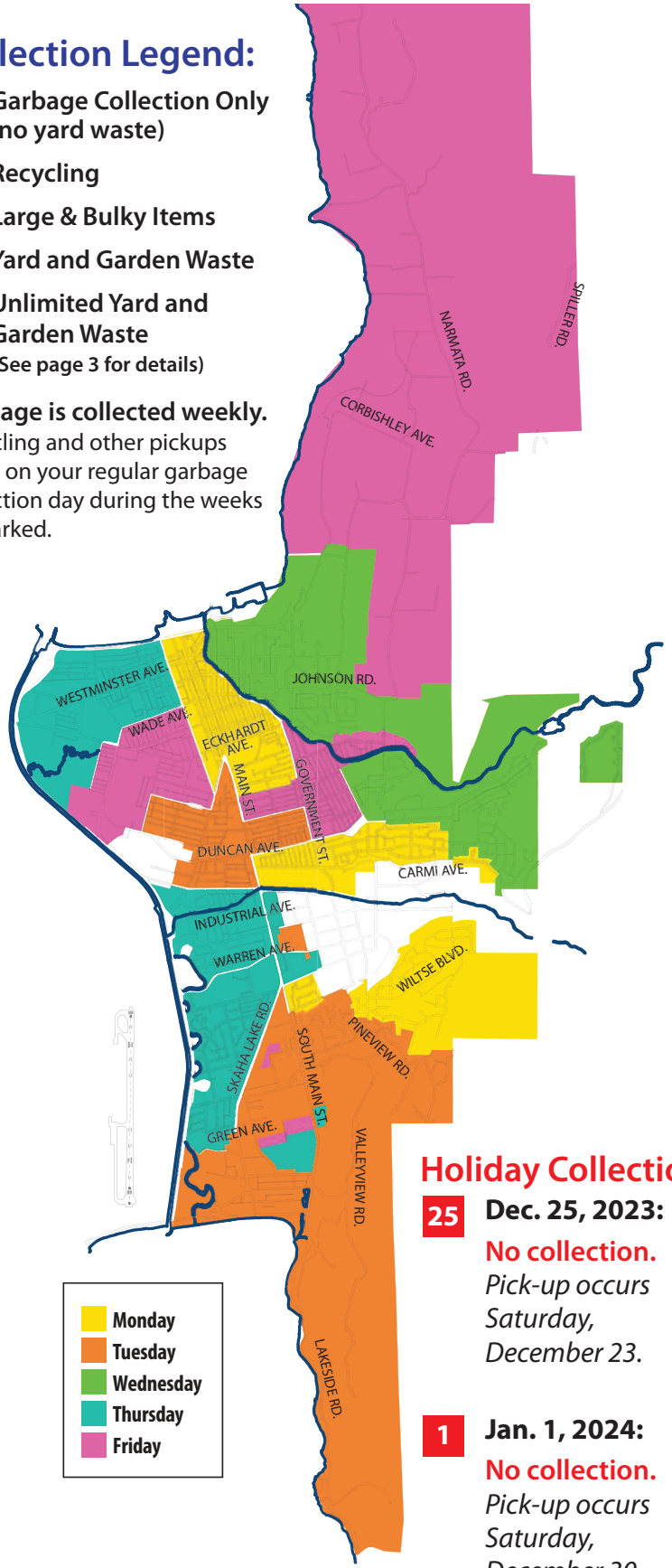
